





Keep the campaign running continuously and make the main event a celebration of the city.




Policy proposal by University team

I. RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MAIN PARTIES CONCERNED

1. AEON 1% Club Foundation

A) Responsibilities:

- (a) Within its own capacity, ensuring the overall health and safety of participants during the program.
- (b) Organizing all main events and activities of the program.
- (c) Cooperating with high schools and universities to hold briefing meetings before departure for participants.
- (d) Providing concerning high schools, universities and individual participants with necessary information and instruction of the program.
- (e) Protecting individual's personal information; and upon request of individuals, refraining from publishing their information on website or social networks.
- (f) Covering the following expenses:
 - Round-trip flight tickets between participating countries to the hosting country.
 - ➤ All expenses for lodging, transportation, meals, etc. in the hosting country during the program
 - > Other expenses for organization and preparation of the program

B) Rights:

- (a) Defining criteria for selecting participants of the program; and finalizing the participant list.
- (b) Disqualifying individuals who fail to fulfill the requirement of the program, who negatively affects the safety of other participants and/or the progress of the program.
- (c) Requesting the cooperation from concerning high schools and universities in holding briefing meetings for participants regarding the requirements and preparation for joining the program.
- (d) Requesting its local representatives to work directly with high schools or universities in some cases.

High schools, universities, and/or educational organizations

A. Responsiblities:

- (a) Screening, selecting and submitting to AEON 1% Club Foundation the recommended participants together with application documents required by AEON 1% Club Foundation by the submission deadline (see Selection criteria and method for more detail).
- (b) Ensuring the equality in participant selection based on AEON 1% Club Foundation's defined criteria.
- (c) Cooperating with AEON 1% Club Foundation (or its local representativeso) in holding briefing meeting (orientation meetings) before departure.
- (d) Cooperating with AEON 1% Club Foundation in ensuring participants' health and safety before and during the program.
- (e) Covering expenses for selection of participants (except special cases) and briefing meetings.

B. Rights:

- (a) Deciding suitable selection method based on city/school/university circumstances and AEON 1% Club Foundation's selection criteria
- (b) Requesting AEON 1% Club Foundation for necessary information of the program.
